**Downtown Victoria:** 7.4 FTE FPs hired out of 13.9 FTE MRPs approved. An additional 1.4 FTE FP have been hired with start dates in the coming months. RNs and other staff hired in ratio to number of FPs/NPs hired so as to create balanced teams. Opened at permanent site in the last 6 months. Service will continue to expand as the site stabilizes and as MRP recruitment allows. Funded Clinical FTEs does not include 10.5 FP FTEs for Established Family Practice Stabilization resources, representing community FPs moving their practices and panels into available space in the clinic.





### Province Clinical Hiring Progress at P3 22/23









### CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

Data in this report reflect approved resources as well as recruitment and financial status information submitted to the Ministry of Health on January 5, 2023, and is subject to change dependent on any retrospective adjustments to reporting submitted to the Ministry.

### TARGETS AND EXPECTATIONS

The recruitment targets identified in this report represent full-implementation totals for Urgent & Primary Care Centres (UPCCs).

### **SOURCE DATA**

This report was compiled using financial period tracking templates submitted by each health authority's finance department. The information in these financial period tracking templates is then cross-referenced with human resources information submitted to the Ministry through a separate webform. Supplementary information is then obtained from health authorities where variances between these sources occur.

### **DATA ANALYSIS**

As this is a high-level overview report, most data have been rounded to exclude decimals beyond the first decimal place, meaning the grand total may appear different than the sum of the rows (e.g., 0.22 rounds to 0.2 but 3 \* 0.22 = 0.66, which rounds to 0.7). Note that the grand totals are calculated using the non-rounded figures and are correct. Baseline approved budgets have been updated from previous reports to reflect FY2022/23 Funding Transfer Agreements and any approved Change Requests and are accurate as of January 5, 2023.

### **DATA KEY**

Dashes (-) indicate where no resources have been approved. Zeroes (0.0) indicate that no hires have been made to-date. Community Health Worker (CHW) FTEs are included in the Allied Health FTEs' column. Medical Lead (FP/NP) FTEs funded outside of overhead funding will be included in the Physician FTEs' column unless the initiative is not approved for Physicians—in those cases, the FTEs will be included under Nurse Practitioner FTEs. Non-clinical FTEs include CHC Executive/Senior Directors, Nursing Assistants and Unit Aides, and exclude resources covered by overhead and/or change management funding (e.g., medical office assistants, change managers).




### PATIENT VISITS TO DATE

### CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

Data in this report reflect approved resources as well as recruitment and financial status information submitted to the Ministry of Health on February 2, 2023, and is subject to change dependent on any retrospective adjustments to reporting submitted to the Ministry.

### TARGETS AND EXPECTATIONS

The recruitment targets identified in this report represent full-implementation totals for Urgent & Primary Care Centres (UPCCs).

### **SOURCE DATA**

This report was compiled using financial period tracking templates submitted by each health authority's finance department. The information in these financial period tracking templates is then cross-referenced with human resources information submitted to the Ministry through a separate webform. Supplementary information is then obtained from health authorities where variances between these sources occur.

### **DATA ANALYSIS**

As this is a high-level overview report, most data have been rounded to exclude decimals beyond the first decimal place, meaning the grand total may appear different than the sum of the rows (e.g., 0.22 rounds to 0.2 but 3 \* 0.22 = 0.66, which rounds to 0.7). Note that the grand totals are calculated using the non-rounded figures and are correct. Baseline approved budgets have been updated from previous reports to reflect FY2022/23 Funding Transfer Agreements and any approved Change Requests and are accurate as of February 2, 2023.

### **DATA KEY**

Dashes (-) indicate where no resources have been approved. Zeroes (0.0) indicate that no hires have been made to-date. Community Health Worker (CHW) FTEs are included in the Allied Health FTEs' column. Medical Lead (FP/NP) FTEs funded outside of overhead funding will be included in the Physician FTEs' column unless the initiative is not approved for Physicians—in those cases, the FTEs will be included under Nurse Practitioner FTEs. Non-clinical FTEs include CHC Executive/Senior Directors, Nursing Assistants and Unit Aides, and exclude resources covered by overhead and/or change management funding (e.g., medical office assistants, change managers).




### PATIENT VISITS AT A GLANCE

#### CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

Data in this report reflect approved resources as well as recruitment and financial status information submitted to the Ministry of Health on March 31, 2023, and is subject to change dependent on any retrospective adjustments to reporting submitted to the Ministry.

#### TARGETS AND EXPECTATIONS

The recruitment targets identified in this report represent full-implementation totals for Urgent & Primary Care Centres (UPCCs).

#### **SOURCE DATA**

This report was compiled using financial period tracking templates submitted by each health authority's finance department. The information in these financial period tracking templates is then cross-referenced with human resources information submitted to the Ministry through a separate webform. Supplementary information is then obtained from health authorities where variances between these sources occur.

#### **DATA ANALYSIS**

As this is a high-level overview report, most data have been rounded to exclude decimals beyond the first decimal place, meaning the grand total may appear different than the sum of the rows (e.g., 0.22 rounds to 0.2 but 3 \* 0.22 = 0.66, which rounds to 0.7). Note that the grand totals are calculated using the non-rounded figures and are correct. Baseline approved budgets have been updated from previous reports to reflect FY2022/23 Funding Transfer Agreements and any approved Change Requests and are accurate as of March 31, 2023.

#### **DATA KEY**

Dashes (-) indicate where no resources have been approved. Zeroes (0.0) indicate that no hires have been made to-date. Community Health Worker (CHW) FTEs are included in the Allied Health FTEs' column. Medical Lead (FP/NP) FTEs funded outside of overhead funding will be included in the Physician FTEs' column unless the initiative is not approved for Physicians—in those cases, the FTEs will be included under Nurse Practitioner FTEs. Non-clinical FTEs include CHC Executive/Senior Directors, Nursing Assistants and Unit Aides, and exclude resources covered by overhead and/or change management funding (e.g., medical office assistants, change managers).




#### PATIENT VISITS AT A GLANCE



### Vancouver Coastal Patient Visits (FY 22/23)







#### CONTEXTUAL INFORMATION

Data in this report reflect approved resources as well as recruitment and financial status information submitted to the Ministry of Health on March 3, 2023, and is subject to change dependent on any retrospective adjustments to reporting submitted to the Ministry.

#### TARGETS AND EXPECTATIONS

The recruitment targets identified in this report represent full-implementation totals for Urgent & Primary Care Centres (UPCCs).

#### **SOURCE DATA**

This report was compiled using financial period tracking templates submitted by each health authority's finance department. The information in these financial period tracking templates is then cross-referenced with human resources information submitted to the Ministry through a separate webform. Supplementary information is then obtained from health authorities where variances between these sources occur.

#### **DATA ANALYSIS**

As this is a high-level overview report, most data have been rounded to exclude decimals beyond the first decimal place, meaning the grand total may appear different than the sum of the rows (e.g., 0.22 rounds to 0.2 but 3 \* 0.22 = 0.66, which rounds to 0.7). Note that the grand totals are calculated using the non-rounded figures and are correct. Baseline approved budgets have been updated from previous reports to reflect FY2022/23 Funding Transfer Agreements and any approved Change Requests and are accurate as of March 3, 2023.

#### **DATA KEY**

Dashes (-) indicate where no resources have been approved. Zeroes (0.0) indicate that no hires have been made to-date. Community Health Worker (CHW) FTEs are included in the Allied Health FTEs' column. Medical Lead (FP/NP) FTEs funded outside of overhead funding will be included in the Physician FTEs' column unless the initiative is not approved for Physicians—in those cases, the FTEs will be included under Nurse Practitioner FTEs. Non-clinical FTEs include CHC Executive/Senior Directors, Nursing Assistants and Unit Aides, and exclude resources covered by overhead and/or change management funding (e.g., medical office assistants, change managers).




#### PATIENT VISITS AT A GLANCE
